



Welcome to Market Square! We're so glad you're here to celebrate the installation of The Rev. Stan Jenkins as our next called and installed pastor. Restrooms are located just outside the sanctuary in the hallway. If you parked in the garage, our staff member with the parking ticket you'll need to exit is in the atrium (see instructions to the right). Please silence your devices as you enter the sanctuary and prepare for worship.

Parking Process

The church does not own the Market Square Garage but we pay for worship service parking. You will receive the first of two exit tickets when you press the button to enter the garage. Please do not misplace that first ticket; if you do, the garage will charge you a \$32 lost ticket fee which is your responsibility to pay. In order to exit the garage at no cost to you, you must obtain a second ticket with the number 2 written on it. At the exit machine, wait until the gate is down, then insert the ticket you received when

insert the ticket you received when entering the garage, bar code facing up. When the machine asks for payment, insert the ticket you received from the church, bar code up. If you have any problem, press the telephone icon on the exit gate machine and tell the call center representative that you are at the



Cover Art

The images of Market Square Church's three buildings are from the church's archives. While founded in 1794 by members of Paxton Church, the English Presbyterian Congregation of Harrisburg worshiped in the loft of the city jail and later in the county court house until its first building was built at Second and Cherry streets. That building was enlarged once and then razed to make room for a new building on the same site. That building was destroyed by fire, and the present church was built on the edge of Market Square, from which it took its name.
