When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the *rush of a violent wind*. And it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Acts 2:1-2 NRSV

Pentecost by El Greco, ca. 1600, depicts the moment when the Holy Spirit, in the form of flames, rests on the Virgin and the Apostles on Pentecost Day in Jerusalem, as is told in the book of Acts. The bald, bearded Apostle who looks out at the viewer from the right of the canvas has been identified as a self-portrait or as a portrait of the artist's friend. Along with other paintings in the Prado Museum in Madrid, this work was painted as part of the main altarpiece for the church of the Augustine College of María de Aragón in Madrid.

OUR MISSION

CHILDREN — Children of all ages are always welcome! There are worship bags in a basket in the Narthex with crayons, paper, hymn markers, and children's bulletins. On Sundays, nursery care is available for children (infants through 5-year-olds) in the Youth Room (Level 4). The nursery is staffed by Lizzie Camilli, our Child Caregiver, and volunteers. During worship, after a prayer of blessing for them, a children's Sunday School is offered in the Youth Room (Level 4). The teachers will lead the children from the sanctuary and parents may pick them up after worship (go up the stairs or elevator to the fourth floor and follow the signs).

PARKING AT MSPC — You will receive the first of two exit tickets when you press the button to enter the garage. Please do not misplace that first ticket; if you do, the garage will charge you a \$30 lost ticket fee which is your responsibility to pay. We URGE you to put your entrance ticket where you will find it when you leave the parking garage. In order to exit the garage at no cost to you, you must obtain a second ticket with the number 2 written on it. Do not insert your tickets until the person in front of you has exited and the gate has come down again. At the exit machine, insert the ticket you received when entering the garage into the machine, bar code facing up. When the machine asks for payment, insert the ticket you received from the church into the machine, bar code facing up. If you have any kind of problem, press the telephone icon on the exit gate machine and tell the call center representative that you are at the Market Square Garage and your validated exit ticket is not working.

OUR LIVESTREAM — Please be aware that our service is livestreamed and available in recorded format on our website. At times, the backs of the heads of congregants seated in the pews are seen. If you wish to avoid the back of your head appearing in a livestream, please sit on the right side of the sanctuary (the side closest to Blackberry Street) or anywhere in the last two pews. When coming forward to receive communion, please join the line on the right side of the sanctuary which will not be seen in the livestream.

Tom also gave leadership to a disaster response program started by CCU called "Lend-A-Hand," which has since expanded and spun-off to rebuild destroyed property all over the Eastern United States.
